The Importance of Community

La importancia de la comunidad

The first reading and the gospel for Divine Mercy Sunday Year A both highlight the importance of community. The early Christians devoted themselves to the apostles' teachings, fellowship, and prayer. They shared their resources and took care of each other's needs. This strong sense of community helped them grow in faith and in number.

In the gospel, the disciples are gathered together in fear and uncertainty. Jesus appears to them as they are united in one place. His presence brings them peace, courage, and purpose. Thomas misses the first encounter because he is not with them. But when he joins the community, he experiences the risen Lord and moves from doubt to faith.

This shows that faith is not meant to be lived alone. Divine Mercy Sunday Year A teaches us that community is essential for growing in faith. We support each other, learn from each other, and share our joys and struggles. Being in community helps us encounter Jesus in new ways.

We are called to build and strengthen our faith communities. This means being present for one another, praying together, and sharing what we have. Divine Mercy Sunday Year A invites us to create communities of mercy, love, and hope, just as the early Christians did.

Divine Mercy Sunday Year A calls us to embrace God's mercy and extend it to others. It encourages us to carry our scars with faith, trust in Jesus' presence, and support one another in community. May we grow in faith and love, sharing God's mercy with the world.

La primera lectura y el Evangelio del Domingo de la Divina Misericordia (Ciclo A) destacan, ambos, la importancia de la comunidad. Los primeros cristianos se dedicaban a las enseñanzas de los apóstoles, a la comunión fraterna y a la oración. Compartían sus recursos y atendían las necesidades de los demás. Este fuerte sentido de comunidad les ayudó a crecer tanto en la fe como en número.

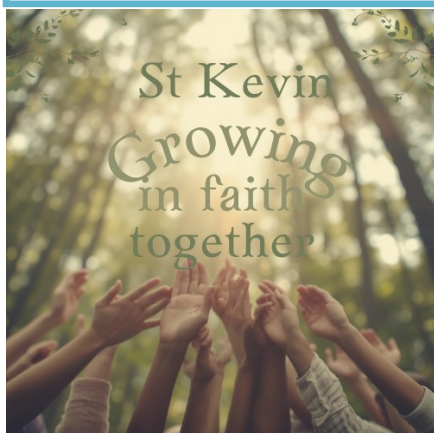
En el Evangelio, los discípulos se encuentran reunidos, llenos de temor e incertidumbre. Jesús se les aparece mientras están unidos en un mismo lugar. Su presencia les infunde paz, valentía y un sentido de propósito. Tomás se pierde este primer encuentro porque no se encuentra con ellos; sin embargo, al unirse a la comunidad, experimenta la presencia del Señor resucitado y transita del escepticismo a la



fe. Esto nos enseña que la fe no está destinada a vivirse en soledad. El Domingo de la Divina Misericordia (Ciclo A) nos enseña que la comunidad es esencial para crecer en la fe. Nos apoyamos mutuamente, aprendemos unos de otros y compartimos tanto nuestras alegrías como nuestras dificultades. Vivir en comunidad nos ayuda a encontrarnos con Jesús de maneras nuevas y profundas.

Estamos llamados a edificar y fortalecer nuestras comunidades de fe. Esto implica estar presentes los unos para los otros, orar juntos y compartir lo que tenemos. El Domingo de la Divina Misericordia (Ciclo A) nos invita a crear comunidades de misericordia, amor y esperanza, tal como lo hicieron los primeros cristianos.

El Domingo de la Divina Misericordia (Ciclo A) nos convoca a acoger la misericordia de Dios y a extenderla hacia los demás. Nos alienta a llevar nuestras cicatrices con fe, a confiar en la presencia de Jesús y a apoyarnos mutuamente en el seno de la comunidad.
